During the depression his family moved to Boise, Idaho where Shad earned an Associate's Degree at Boise State College. The family then moved to Seattle, where Shad joined the Boeing Company. While working for Boeing, he attended night classes at the University of Washington earning a degree in mechanical engineering. He excelled at hiking, mountain climbing, hunting, ice skating, skiing, and power boater. He enjoyed individual sports and became a skilled trumpet and cornet player performing at local bandstands. To continue his legacy, this scholarship has been established to foster the educational opportunities for the students of Miller High School.

Scholarship Requirements
